



SIMPLE RESEARCH STEPS

1 START WITH DATABASES

Use World Book Online (bit.ly/2uOYd6R), databases available through the public library (bit.ly/2G2cfZe), and databases available through PDCCC (DC classes only).



2 SEARCH FOR BOOKS

Use online card catalogs to search for books in the SHS library (bit.ly/2YScjCc), the public library (blackwaterlib.org), and PDCCC (pdc.edu/library).



3 USE RELIABLE WEBSITES

Use the CRAAP Test (see handout) to evaluate websites and advanced Google search queries (see handout) to narrow your results. Searching Google Scholar (scholar.google.com) will provide a list of scholarly literature available on the internet.




4 COMPLETE THE RESEARCH PROCESS
